# Safety in the Mounting & Use of Abrasive Wheels

# Introduction

Employers must provide training for operators of grinding machines and abrasive wheels, in compliance with their responsibilities under the Health & Safety at Work etc Act 1974 and the Provision and Use of Work Equipment 1998. They must ensure that employees who operate grinding wheels:

Have been trained in accordance with the Schedule of Training Are competent to carry out the duty

Supervisors, persons who mount abrasive wheels and managers with the responsibility for Health & Safety.
